SOLDIERS. As his patriotism is called upon, the soldier draws the short straw. He is lured by promises of mateship and adventure, or at least good pay and a decent professional education. But first the soldier must be trained to kill. This training is merciless. Next our soldier has to pay for his education. He has to endure - and inflict - unspeakable horrors. Then the soldier is returned to society. But the horrors of war are burnt into his mind. Will he cope?

A soldier, who served for only six weeks, had witnessed an atrocity involving a civilian victim and had to listen to the sounds of a man slowly dying, after he shot him.

When he returned from his tour of duty he became a drunk and suffered from post-traumatic stress disorder and severe depression. After a few months he suicided.
